Jerry passed Thursday, November 28, 2019. He was my beloved brother and had the biggest personality of anyone I've ever known. He had a love for life and enjoyed many things but his passion was flying helicopters, fishing, telling stories of his many military adventures and spending time with his family!

He was born May 21, 1968. He attended Palestine High School and was a member of the Palestine Band! #Go Wildcats. He graduated in 1986. After High-school, he joined the Army in July 1986. Attended Basic Training and Advanced Infantry School at Ft. Benning, GA. In November 1986 he was stationed at Ft Richardson, AK as a Rifleman and a Radio Telephone Operator. One year later, he joined the Recon Platoon. During his stay in the great Northwest territory he attended Combat Leaders Course, Combat Lifesavers Course, Air-Assault Course and Ranger School along with Arctic Survival School conducted by native Alaskans. Upon obtaining the Rank of Sergeant, he reenlisted to serve with the 1st Ranger Battalion, located in Savannah, GA. Here as a Squad Leader he performed duties such as Parachuting, Rappelling. Rapids, and numerous Ambushes. Waterborne operations were also conducted during his time as a leader with this unit. Operation "Just Cause" permitted him a taste of combat. Later due to a knee injury he was relocated with 3rd Battalion, 15th Infantry Regiment. Two weeks after his arrival Operation Desert Shield called his attention to the Middle East. After leading his men through numerous cross boarder missions into Southern Iraq, and eight months of Desert life, he returned with all his men to encounter yet another challenge. Special Forces Assessment and Selection which was an extremely physical event that proved to be quite challenging for him would be his last accomplishment for the United States Army. Upon completion of this course, he decided not to accept an assignment to South Africa and left the service in January 1992. Jerry has done many things with his life after serving his country. This past year he was working as a realtor with Keller Williams in Temple, Texas. He leaves behind

his mother, Gennie Parker of Palestine, Tx and his sister, Sarah Lamb Beaver of Nolanville, Tx.
